Minutes of the special meeting of the Board of Directors of the Orange Cove Irrigation District, June 6,1945.

The Board of Directors and officers met at 2 p.m. to confer with officials of the U.S. Reclamation Bureau.

Present were Directors M. N. Jensen, Geo. Zaninovich, W. w. Arkley, Treasurer G. C. Bornefeld, Secretary A. L. Schoepf. The reclamation officials were Richard L. Boke, Project Superintendant, Paul T. Regle, Visalia Field Office Superintendant, David S. Stoner, Acting Chief of project development.

The purpose of the meeting was to inform the district officials as to the policy of the reclamation bureau in regard to distribution of the water from the Friant-Kern Canal and to obtain permission if requested to make a preliminary survey of water requirments of the district.

Mr. Stoner presented a map of the project showing dams and proposed anals covering the entire area included in the project. This map and

the proposed developments were explained in detail.

Mr. Boke then explained the water distribution methods of the bureau appertaining to the project. Mr. Boke also explained the meaning of the 160 acre limitation bill in regard to land holdings within the listrict. He also explained the urgent need for irrigation districts to be formed as soon as possible and the method and need of contracting with the Bureau for estimated water requirements. Mr. Boke stated that there were eight hundred thousand acre feet available for distribution bouth of the Friant Dam which would becarried by the Friant Kern Canal. The also informed the district officers that when this amount of water as contracted for there would be no more available, therefore the need for immediate action by all districts contemplating the use of this water.

It was also considered expedient to contact title holders of land djacent to the district and inform then of the necessity of either orming districts or making application for inclusion in the Orange ove Irrigation District. Mr. Regle atated that he would make as many

ontacts as possible.

It was agreed that upon a specified date there would be held a public eeting to discuss this matter and to ascertain what amount of acreage esired inclusion and the amount of water required. The time and place f the meeting would be advertised.

The Secretary was instructed to send a letter to Mr. Boke at acramento authorizing and instructing the Bureau to proceed with a reliminary survey of the water requirements of the District and to ubmit a contract for appoval. This was upon the request of Mr. Boke.

The meeting was then adjourned.

Notes of public meeting of July 20, 1945.

The public heeting of July 20th was held as advertised at 8 p.m. in the Orange Cove School House. The purpose of the meeting was to ascertain as far as possible the amount of acreage outside and adjacent to the Orange Cove Irrigation District desiring inclusion with the Orange Cove District.

The meeting was conducted by Mr. M. N. Jensen, President of the Orange Cove Irrigation District. Reclamation Bureau officials in attendance were Richard L. Boke, Project Superintendent, Paul T. Regle, Visalia Field Office Superintendent, David S. Stoner, Acting Chief os Project develope-

In addition to several landowners in the Orange Cove District these were also eleven from Navelencia and seven from East Orosi.

Mr. Boke spoke at length explaining various angles of the project and answering questions. Mr. Boke impressed upon the audience the need for immediate action in either forming their own district or making application for inclusion in the Orange Cove District.

Mr. Crosby also spoke and answered legal questions.

The Navelencia and Orosi people took immediate action in forming committees to contact landowners in their respective districts to acquaint them with the necessity of taking action to obtain water from the Friant-Kern Canal without further delay.

The comittee from the Navelencia district was composed of J. A. McPherson, Geo. Ketscher, Ed. Brackney, V. J. Kovacovich, and R. J. Hixon.

Mr. H. A. Collin, Myron Miller, H. A. Schoepf and F. I. Goble composed the Orosi committee.

The attendance and interest shown was very gratifying to the Reclamation Bureau officials.

Mr. Boke explained that all preliminary engineering and legal vadvice would be furnished by the Bureau,

Mr. Jensen informed the committees that they would have thirty days in which to submit their petitions for inclusion should they desire to join the Orange Cove Irrigation District.

Mr. Regle offered to meet with the committees in Visalia to assist in the work of defining boundaries, making up petitions, maps, etc.

The regular meeting was postponed from Oct. 2 to Oct. 4. The meeting was called to order at 8 p. m.

Present were Directors M. N. Jensen, President, W. W. Arkley, George Zaninovich, Secretary A. L. Schoepf. Treasurer G. C. Bornefeld was absent. Also present were Attorney Leroy McCormick from Visalia, R. J. Hixon from N avelencia, H. A. Collin and Myron Miller from Orosi.

Bills presented were as follows: A. L. Schoepf, for Petty Cash account 5.00. Ray wright for time and mileage preparing an agricultural census of the District \$26.40. Mr. Arkley moved the bills be paid and motion was seconded by Mr. Jensen.

The question of the District joining the Tulare County Irrigation Districts Association was considered favorably by the Directors, whereupon a motion was made by Mr. Arkley and seconded by Mr. Zaninovich that the Secretary communicate with the Association informing it of the Districts intention and requesting a membership.

The subject of the seven man board to be appointed by the Governor to act as a state water suthority Board was discussed by the Directors. The Directors agreed that it was of the utmost importance that a capable and reliable man who would best serve the interests of this area be appointed. Mr. Arkley made a motion which was seconded by Mr. Zaninovick that the following resolution be passed: "Resolved, that a written request be sent to Governor Earl Warren requesting the appointment of Mr. Irving H. Althouse as a member of the State water Authority Board, that the best interests of this area under the Central Valley Project be served."

mr. Tixon reported that the Navelencia area requesting inclusion had been surveyed and maps completed. Mr. McCormick delivered the petitions for inclusion to Mr. Hixon who said he would abtain signatures as soon as possible. Mr. Collin reported that the East Orosi area was now being surveyed. Mr. Collin said that the delay was due to the illness of the surveyor formerly abtained, but that the work would progress as mapidly as possible.

Mr. McCormick was consulted and answered questions of importance to the District and to the representatives for the petitioners for inclusion.

The question of levying an assessment of thirty-five cents per acre upon the Navelencia and East Orosi districts, as had been done in the Orange Cove District, was discussed and fully explained. The representatives of Navelencia and East Orosi agreed that this plan was fully understood and was agreeable to them. It was also mentioned that at the time of assessment theremight be an additional levy per acre upon the lard in the present range ove district as well as upon the lard included. It as considered that this levy would be

a very nominal sum but would be regulated by the progress in the construction of the friant-tern anal. This plan was also fully explained and was agreeable to all present.

Notes on meeting of Nov. 27, 1945.

A special meeting was held Tuesday evening Nov. 27, at Mr. Jensen's Office.

The principal speakers of the evening were Mr. Stoner, engineer, Mr. Ragle, field superintendent and attorney Ralph Brodie, all

representing the Uninted States Reclamation Bureau.

The meeting was well attended by representatives from Orosi, Navelencia and Orange Cove. Those attending from Orange Cove were Messrs. Jensen, Arkley, Zaninovich, Bornefeld and Schoepf. Orosei were Messrs. Collin, Schoepf, Goble. From Navelencia Messess. Hixon and Cavakovich.

Mr. Stoner was spokesman for the Reclamation Bureau officials. The meat of Mr. Stoner's conversation was the urgent and immediate meed of districts formulating plans for the construction of a distribution system. The explained that the Bureau was willing to The system would be no part construct the system if so desired. of the Central Valleys Project but would be financied by interest free government funds to be paid offin forty years. The system would be under supervision of the Bureau until the major part of the debt was paid. Mr. Stoner advised that should the District desire the Bureau to construct the system the District should communicate with the Bureau asking them to investigate the potentialities for construct ing the distribution system, what investigation might be necessary and the cost thereof. The Bureau would then make a survey determining a paper location of pipe lines, etc., and estimate the cost of construction. One half of the cost of the survey would be paid in advance and in event the Bureau should build the system the balance would be paid over a period of forty years. Should the District decide to have a private concern build the system the total cost of the survey would be paid by the "istrict.

Tr. Stoner intimated the possibility of having water available

by the season of 1947, hence the urgency for being prepared.

The 160 acre limitation act was discussed and explained by Attorney Brodie. It was concluded however that it was the existing law and nothing could be done about it until the law was modified.

Mr. Stoner suggested that those interested begin thinking about the pumping power angle in regard to having the Government furnish the power for the contemplated pumping stations to lift the water above the canal. He explained that the cost would be in the ratio of about two and one-half mills to five and one-half y dustick the if purchased from private concerns. The meeting was then concluded.
