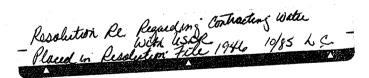

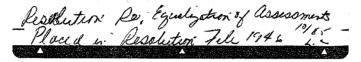

The minutes of the regular meeting of Sept. 10 and special meeting of Sept. 23 were read and approved.

Bills totaling \$721.27 were read and ordered paid upon motion by Arkley and seconded by Jensen.

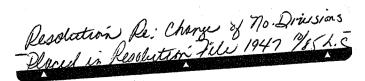

Woolley also gave a report of his negotiations with the Bureau relating to the contract for the building of the distribution system. He also stated that the district had made request for contracts with the Government covering the purchase of water, distribution system, engineering and recordable contracts. All are in the hands of the Government awaiting reply.

The meeting was then adjourned until Dec. 20, 1946.

Each division to constitute one precinct.

The Secretary was instructed to arrange for voting places and to appoint election officers. Also to post three copies of notices of election in each precinct and at the District office.
