Richard Mulholland was present and requested the Board to form an improvement district to serve his lands by means of an over the bank service. The Secretary was instructed to endeavor to obtain a permit for installation of an over the bank service from the U.S.B.R. and upon receiving such permit to have a meeting with 5A landowners to discuss this proposal.

Mr. William Wright of Prudential Insurance Co. presented two proposed pension plans to the Board. No action taken.

It was moved by Director Beach, seconded by Director Dial that the deadline for ordering and paying for water for the 1973 season be February 25, 1973 at 5:00 P.M. Application made after that date will be subject to availability of water and a penalty of 35¢ per acre foot. Motion carried.

It was moved by Director Orlopp, seconded by Director Dial that the President and Secretary be authorized to sign on behalf of the District, the State of California Utilities Agreement No. 672-U-780536 (for relocation of road crossing 5A, under Wooten Creek Bridge on Hills Valley Road.) Motion carried.

It was moved by Director Orlopp, seconded by Director Ketscher that the meeting be adjourned until Wednesday, December 27, 1972 at 10:00 A.M. Motion carried.
