The resolution "Authorizing Investment of Orange Cove Irrigation District Monies in Local Agency Investment Fund" was read to the board and signed by President Harvey S. Chase and Secretary Edward Bickmore.

The resloution "Regarding Institution of Standby Charges in Lieu of Assessments" was read to the board and signed by President Harvey S. Chase and Secretary Edward Bickmore.

Motion was made by Director Beach to authorize the Negative Declaration for District 1A North. (1 North) Motion seconded by Director McFarlin. A roll call was taken as follows:

The policy for the operation and maintenance of District 1 North was discussed. Attorney Moock was instructed to secure agreements with TRI-VALLEY IRRIGATION DISTRICT to cover O.C.I.D. expenses incurred in delivering water to the Crawford Avenue group (1NC) and the SUN DIAL group (1NE). Maintenance charges to those two groups are to be prorated in accordance with their total shares in the main delivery. The ACWA fall conference, the CRA annual meeting and the Water Rights Legislature Symposium were discussed.

The status of water was discussed.

The policies with INA currently in effect were ordered paid and the Secretary was instructed to pursue the matter of other insurers prior to the expiration of our current policy year.

Motion carried.

Attorney Peter Moock reported to the Board that agreements for operating the Crawford Avenue, SunDial and Tri-Valley users system were being prepared.

The Secretary reported that the district used 31,401 a.f. of water during the 1978 water season. This amount was made up of 39,106 a.f. 0.C.I.D. Class I water less 8,000 a.f. transferred to Tulare I.D., plus 295 a.f. purchased from Lower Tule I.D. The cost of the water used was \$218,363.62 including electrical power.

The Board discussed operating delivery costs. By concensus, the Secretary was instructed to prepare interim rates for water for 1979 water year based on the cost per acre foot for: water, power, delivery costs. This rate list is to be presented to the Board for its review and approval at the January meeting.

It being 11:00 A.M., the Board declared on the motion of Director Orlopp, seconded by Director Beach, that the time for acceptance of bids on a diesel pickup truck to be closed. The bids were opened and read as follows:
