

Minutes of the regular meeting of the Board of Directors of Orange Cove Irrigation District held on January 9, 1980.

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 A.M. with the following directors present; President Harvey S. Chase, Directors D.W. Ketscher, Stanley Beach, Richard McFarlin, Oscar Orlopp, Secretary Ed Bickmore.

The minutes of the regular meeting of December 13, 1979 and the regular adjourned meeting of December 15, 1979 were read and approved.

Bills in the amount of \$ 35,126.41 were read, approved and ordered paid on the motion of Director Ketscher, seconded by Director Orlopp. Motion carried.

The status of water was discussed.

Mr. Dambrosia from Orosi was in attendance and spoke to the board concerning problems with water deliveries.

Tom Horne, District Engineer, reported to the board on Maintenance in progress, county plans for reworking Adams Avenue and current status of 1A Construction Project. He also requested guidance from the board on whether to repair the dump truck. Consensus of the board was that the dump truck was not worth repairing.

Tom Horne reported to the board on various prices in plastic pipe and recommended that a mixed truck load be purchased from Water Flow Products, Inc., Visalia for \$6,535.38. Director Orlopp so moved with Director Ketscher seconding the motion. Motion carried.

Mr. Leo McKinney reported to the board that there was problems with a back up weir in District 7 and requested to have Tom Horne check into the problem and get it fixed.

Attorney Doug Jensen arrived.

Mr. Albert Martin requested that 2 pieces of his property now located in District 11B Pipe be changed to District 11B Ditch to make it easier to get water to those properties after they were sold. After much deliberation and discussion, the board found that the parcels could not be transferred to 11B Ditch, but the new landowners could get water from the ditch if they petitioned the board and paid the applicable rental charges. Director Orlopp place into a motion the findings stated above, Director McFarlin seconded the motion. On a roll call vote all directors noted AYE.

Attorney Doug Jensen reported to the board that the insurance firm representing Golden Farms Express had not responded to his efforts to collect the sedan repair costs. Director Beach moved that legal action be authorized to be taken against Golden Farms Express. Director McFarlin seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Attorney Jensen also reported on procedures for collecting construction costs in District 1A. He was instructed by the board to prepare a form for 1A landowners signatures authorizing the project.

The status of IBEW v. OCID was discussed.

It was reported that the district and IBEW have negotiated a three year Memorandum of Understanding and that the district union membership had accepted the Memorandum of Understanding. The Memorandum of Understanding will be in effect from January 1, 1980 till December 31, 1982.

After some discussion it was determined that all over collections, however small, made in error on the Maintenance billing should be refunded by check.

Recessed for lunch at 12:15 P.M. Reconvened at 1:45 P.M. with the same parties present as the mornings session, except Attorney Doug Jensen.

Secretary Ed Bickmore reported on his trip to San Francisco and his meeting with Attorney Fred Morgan.

Director McFarlin moved that Treasurer Ernie Mason be reappointed for another two years and that the bond required for the Treasurer be obtained. Director Beach seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The secretary read ACWA's call for Committee Members. President Chase volunteered to serve on the Dues and Agricultural Water Committees.

The board discussed the performance of Howard Barker in his job as Administrative Assistant and reviewed the salary for the position along at his request. On the motion of Director Ketscher, seconded by Director McFarlin the board raised Mr. Barker salary \$100.00 per month effective January 1, 1980. Motion carried.

Director Ketscher moved that the district authorize pay off of any Compensatory Time Off (Comp Time) which district employees may have on the books as of December 31, 1979 at the rate of pay in effect during 1979. Director Beach seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Director Ketscher moved that the following delivery charges be enacted for 1980:

Director Beach seconded the motion. Motion carried.

On the motion of Director Ketscher a penalty of \$.35 an acre foot was established for all water orders placed after February 25, 1980 and for water used over and above water ordered on time. Director McFarlin seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Director Orlopp moved that the following rates per acre foot be established for the water year 1980 pending determination of actual cost:

Director McFarlin seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The problems arising from water transfers were discussed. On the motion of Director Beach the following policy concerning water transfers was adopted: WATER TRANSFERS:

1. BETWEEN SAME ENTITY. A landowner having properties in two or more SYSTEMS, may transfer water, without penalty, between one SYSTEM to another SYSTEM. The difference in estimated costs must be paid at the time of transfer.
2. BETWEEN DIFFERENT ENTITIES. A landowner may transfer water to another landowner by filing a WATER TRANSFER FORM with the District office. A TRANSFER CHARGE of 35¢ an Acre Foot and the difference in Estimated Costs must be paid at the time of transfer. The district assumes no responsibility for collecting monies due Transferor from the transferee. Both the Transferor and Transferee must sign the WATER TRANSFER FORM.


Director Orlopp seconded the motion. Motion carried.

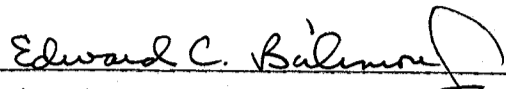
The Notice to Water users for the 1980 water season was read, discussed and approved.

The RULES and REGULATIONS for WATER DELIVERIES was read, discussed and approved as ammended this date.

The Secretary was instructed to send out the Notice to Water users along with the approved Rules and Regulations, the schedule of Estimated Costs in 1980 and a water order form.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 4:00 P.M. on the motion of Director Orlopp, seconded by Director Beach. Motion carried.

Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors of Orange Cove Irrigation District held on February 13, 1980.

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 A.M. with the following directors and officers present: President Harvey S. Chase, Directors D.W. Ketscher, Stanley Beach, Richard McFarlin, Oscar Orlopp and Secretary Ed Bickmore.

The minutes of the regular meeting of January 9, 1980 were read and approved.

Bills in the amount of \$ 46,663.11 were read, approved and ordered paid on the motion of Director Ketscher, seconded by Director McFarlin. Motion carried.

The status of water was discussed.

Mrs. Marie McMillan was in attendance and spoke to the board about having to pay Maintenance charges when she doesn't take water on the property. The board explained the obligations of landowners within Improvement Districts. Mrs. McMillan left the board room.

Tom Horne, engineer for the district, discussed maintenance in progress, the major repairs just completed in ID 1A, the new proposed electrical power rates and the replacement of pump in turn out 10 and 5A. Director McFarlin moved that Tommy's Pump be authorized to replace the pumps per his bids. Director Orlopp seconded the motion. Motion carried.

On the motion of Director Orlopp, seconded by Director Beach, Edward C. Bickmore was reappointed as Assessor-Collector for two years until March 1, 1982. Bonds were authorized to cover the Assessor/Collector, and Secretary/Manager position for the period March 1980 through March 1982. On a roll call vote all directors voted AYE, No Noes, No Absent.

The engagement and representation letter for Baker, Peterson and Franklin were read and approved as written on the motion of Director Orlopp, seconded by Director Ketscher. Motion carried.

The Secretary reported on the following:


- a. Watertender staffing.
- b. Upper San Joaquin River Water & Power Authority.
- c. Fresno County distribution of Funds.

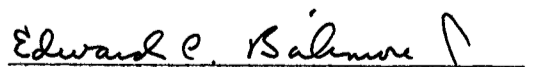
Director Orlopp moved that it be the policy of the district to place any employee on unpaid leave of absence when workers compensation payments begin and throughout the term of the workers disability in accordance with terms of the districts agreement with the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers. Motion seconded by Director Ketscher. Motion carried.

On the motion of Director Orlopp, seconded by Director McFarlin, \$75.00 was authorized for payment to Western Water Education Foundation. Motion carried.

Director Orlopp moved that the district pay the \$10.00 membership fee to the San Joaquin Valley Ag-Water Committee for 1980. Director Ketscher seconded the motion. Motion carried.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 12:00 Noon on the motion of Director Orlopp, seconded by Director Beach. Motion carried.

Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors of Orange Cove Irrigation District held on March 12, 1980.

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 A.M. with the following directors and officers present: President Harvy S. Chase, Directors D.W. Ketscher, Richard McFarlin, Oscar Orlopp and Secretary Ed Bickmore.

The minutes of the regular meeting of February 13, 1980 were read and approved.

Bills in the amount of \$ 117,364.19 were read, approved and ordered paid on the motion of Director Ketscher, seconded by Director McFarlin. Motion carried.

The status of water was discussed. Director Orlopp moved that the manager prepare a Resolution to the Water and Power Resources Service to authorize the manager to take "Flood Water" when available and when useable by the District. Director Ketscher seconded the motion. On a roll call vote Directors Chase, Orlopp, Ketscher and McFarlin voted AYE. No NOES. Director Beach ABSENT.

The manager reported to the Board that Lower Tule River Irrigation District purchased the 387 acre feet of water, the district had remaining on the 1979 contract year. The purchase price was \$15.00 per acre foot.

Attorney Doug Jensen arrived.

Engineer Tom Horne reported to the Board on Maintenance in Progress, replacement of approximately 600 feet of line in Improvement District 11A, status of pump repairs in Improvement District 5A and Turnout 10.

After a discussion on the need for an air compressor, Director McFarlin moved that the district purchase the 5HP, AIR KING Compressor from Smith's Auto Parts, Dinuba for \$648.00. Director Orlopp seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Three bids for 2 tires for the Catapilar Digger were reviewed. Jackson bid, being the lowest, had been accepted and the tires placed on order. The Board ratified the action taken.

Engineer Tom Horne presented to the Board the preliminary findings of TUDOR ENGINEERING concerning the developing of electrical power at SAND CREEK check in the FRIANT-KERN Canal. It was reported that TUDOR believes the project may be feasible and will undertake a feasibility study for \$10,000. The budget of \$6,000.00 Grant money, \$2,000.00 of IN-KIND Services and \$4,000.00 Cash was proposed to be submitted to the California Energy Commission by TUDOR. Director Orlopp moved that TUDOR ENGINEERING be authorized to make application for the district to the California Energy Commission and if the grant is approved that TUDOR be engaged to make a feasibility study of the project for the district at the budget set forth above. Director McFarlin seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Attorney Doug Jensen reported to the Board his negotiations with Golden Farms & Western Carriers Insurance Exchange. He reported that the Insurance Company was willing to make a settlement out of court for 60% of the claim, an amount of \$1,144.14. Considering the additional cost to the district to pursue our claim through the courts and the unpredictability of the court granted settlement, Mr. Jensen recommended to the Board that the district accept the Insurance Company's offer. Director Orlopp moved that the district accept Western Carriers Insurance Exchange's offer of \$1,144.14 as full settlement of our claim. Director Ketscher seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The Special Assessment of landowners in Improvement District 1A was discussed with attorney Jensen. Because of the urgency needed to complete repairs to the system before the rains began, it was necessary to go ahead with the major repairs before such monies were collected. Resolution 1-80 was prepared to cover the collection of monies needed to reimburse the district.

RESOLUTION 1-80: Regarding the Assessment of Landowners in Improvement District 1A for Improvements made in the Irrigation system.

The subject of "Freedom of Information" and "Public Disclosure" were discussed with Attorney Doug Jensen. Because the district has no stated policy concerning these subjects, Director Orlopp moved and Director McFarlin seconded the motion to authorize Attorney Jensen to prepare a proposed Policy and Procedure to full-

fill the districts obligation in these matters. Motion carried.

Bob Williams, CPA, Baker, Peterson and Franklin presented the Financial Statements to the Board and discussed the condition of records maintained at the district office. Copies of the Financial Statements were made available to the directors and a copy is maintained in the district office for review by the public.

The meeting was recessed for lunch at 11:55 A.M.

The meeting was called to order at 1:05 P.M. with the President, Secretary and the Directors present at the morning session again present. Attorney Doug Jensen had been excused from the afternoon session.

The Secretary read to the Board the FRIANT WATER USERS ASSN positions paper concerning the revision to be made to the Reclamation Law. The Board stated their concurrence with the Association's stated positions.

The Secretary read a call for petition signatures from the California Chamber of Commerce for a Constitutional Amendment permitting either body of the legislature to invalidate state agency regulations by separate resolution.

The Secretary presented a draft resolution for Special District representation on Fresno County, LAFCO board as permitted by law. The Board approved the concept on the motion of Director Ketscher, seconded by Director McFarlin. All Directors present voted AYE, No NOES, Director Beach ABSENT. The Secretary is to submit the Draft resolution to Attorney Doug Jensen for any possible rewording and return to the district.

The Secretary was instructed to obtain reservations for Directors Chase, Beach, McFarlin, Orlopp and S/M Bickmore for the ACWA Spring Convention to be held at the Los Angeles Biltmore Hotel on May 20-21, 1980.

Manager Ed Bickmore was authorized to attend the Workshop on Jarvis II to be held in Fresno on May 6, 1980.

RESOLUTION 2-80: Regarding the Deposits of Interest into the Checking Account.

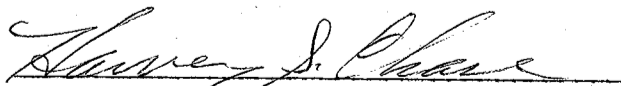
Manager Ed Bickmore presented a survey of vehicles to the Board showing the present condition and use of each vehicle presently owned by the district. A requirements study of vehicles required was then presented. After much discussion Director Orlopp moved that bids be solicited for a 1 Ton Flatbed work truck and 1 Ton Utility Bed work truck. Such bids are to be returned as soon as possible, and on March 24, the Manager will poll each Board member for concurrence to proceed with the best bid. Such action is taken to reduce lead time necessary for delivery of these trucks to the district. Action on a Dump truck is being delayed pending further study of alternative available. Motion seconded by Director McFarlin. Motion carried.

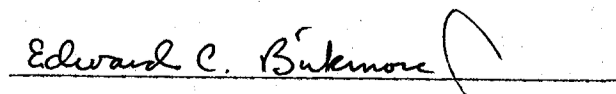
The Manager presented a request from Walt Hayhurst to include 19.25 acres of land into Improvement District 5A. The Manager was instructed to accept his request upon the payment of \$701.13 on the motion of Director Orlopp, seconded by Director McFarlin. Motion carried.

The Manager presented a letter from Mr. Artmejian concerning payment for water he got that he didn't order. Director Orlopp moved that the amounts charged to his account for water which were not ordered be removed. Director McFarlin seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Notice was taken that P G & E has offered to give the district a SUMMARY BILLING of charges on its 102 accounts after pressure was brought to bear by Attorney Doug Jensen through the District Manager in Fresno.

There being no further business, Director Orlopp moved and Director Ketscher seconded the motion to adjourn. The meeting was adjourned at 2:15 P.M.

Minutes of the regular meeting of the Board of Directors of Orange Cove Irrigation District held on April 9, 1980.

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. with the following directors and officers present: President Harvey S. Chase, Directors D.W. Ketscher, Stanley Beach, Richard McFarlin, Oscar Orlopp and Secretary Ed Bickmore.

The minutes of the regular meeting of March 12, 1980 were read and approved.

Bills in the amount of \$ 61,440.65 were read, approved and ordered paid on the motion of Director Ketscher, seconded by Director McFarlin, Motion carried.

The Secretary made a report on the financial status of the District and current status of District cash deposits.

The Year to date expenses were reviewed and compared to the budget.

The Status of Water was discussed. Resolution 4-80 regarding Flood Releases from Millerton Lake was read, approved and ordered signed.

Tom Horne, District Engineer, reported to the board on Maintenance in Progress, status of ID 11A and ID 14 pipe replacement projects, and the current status of the Districts request to the California Energy Commission for a study grant to determine the feasibility of generating electrical power at the Sand Creek check. It was reported the State had approved \$6,000.00 to be matched by \$4,000.00 from the District plus \$2,000.00 of IN-KIND Services to be preformed by the Engineer and Manager. TUDOR Engineering made the application on behalf of the District and has agreed to conduct the feasibility study.

The Manager made the bid sheets available to the Directors for the 2 One Ton Trucks ordered in the March 12, 1980 meeting. The selection of the bid of MARTINS CHEVROLET, REEDLEY of \$8,491.43 for the Utility Truck, and the bid of HOLLOWELL CHEVROLET, CLOVIS of \$7,506.84 for the Flat bed truck were ratified on the motion of Director Orlopp, seconded by Director Ketscher. Motion carried.

The purchase of the 1964 Chevrolet Dump Truck from Bink Werfel, Fresno for \$4,250.00 was ratified by the motion of Director Orlopp, seconded by Director Ketscher. Motion carried.

On the motion of Director Orlopp, seconded by Director Ketscher, the Manager was authorized to sell the old District dump truck for \$750.00 or more Motion carried.

RESOLUTION 3-80 Regarding Inspection of District Records,

A report on the status of IBEW v OCID was made. Director Ketscher moved that Attorney Fred Morgan be authorized to represent the District in court at any proceedings of IBEW v OCID regardless of whether he might also have to provide testimony. Director Orlopp seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The Secretary reported that there was negotiations between Attorney Fred Morgan and the IBEW's Attorneys to settle IBEW v OCID out of court. Director Orlopp moved that Attorney Fred Morgan be authorized to arrange settlement in the Districts best interest and, if settled, the District agree to send the following letter to each of its employees:

The District and the International Brotherhood of Electrical workers (IBEW) Local 1245 have entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) effective until December 31, 1982. The rights of the parties and the employees will be governed by the MOU and the provisions of the Meyers-Milias - Brown Act, Section 3502 as follows: "Except as otherwise provided by the legislature, public employees shall have the right to form, join and participate in the activities of employees organizations of their own choosing for the purpose of representation on all matters of employer - employee relations. Public employees also shall have the right to refuse to join or participate in the activities of employee organizations and shall have the right to represent themselves individually in their employment relations with the public agency." The parties agree to respect and abide by these provisions.

Director Beach seconded the motion. Motion carried.

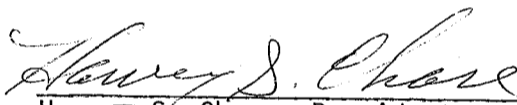
The Secretary reported that Attorney Doug Jensen had researched the proposition that OCID Directors favor Special District representation on "Local Agency Formation Commission" (LAFCO). After discussing the pros and cons of the proposition, the Directors agreed with the advice of Attorney Jensen that the cons were greater than the pros. On the motion of Director Ketscher seconded by Director Beach the Board rescinds action taken in this matter at the March 12, 1980 meeting of the Board. Motion carried.

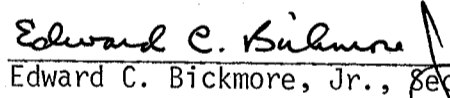
Director Beach moved that the Manager pre-register ACWA Spring Conference activities for Mr. & Mrs. Beach, Richard McFarlin, Oscar Orlopp, Mr. & Mrs. Bickmore. Director McFarlin seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The Board recessed for lunch at 11:55 a.m. Reconvened at 1:50 p.m. with all Directors and Secretary present.

The Secretary presented a proposed organizational structure for the District along with Job Descriptions for the positions revised. The new organizational concept has the District Engineers's position being redesignated as Assistant Manager/Engineer and the former Superintendent's position being redesignated Field Superintendent. The job descriptions were reviewed in detail and the reorganization was considered as to the operational and cost factors involved. The reorganization recognizes that both the Assistant Manager/Engineer and Field Superintendent's positions are needed on a full time basis and increases the authorized full time personnel structure to 12, plus 1 half-time position. After much discussion Director McFarlin moved that the organization and staffing as set forth above be adopted. Director Orlopp seconded the motion. Motion carried with Director Beach voting against adoption.

There being no further business Director Orlopp moved and Director Beach seconded the motion to adjourn. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 3:15 p.m.

Minutes of the Regular meeting of the Board of Directors of Orange Cove Irrigation District held on May 14, 1980.

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 A.M. with following directors and officers present. President Harvey S. Chase, Directors D.W. Ketscher, Stanley C. Beach, Oscar Orlopp and Secretary Edward C. Bickmore.

The minutes of the Regular meeting of April 9, 1980 were read and approved.

Director McFarlin arrived.

Bills in the amount of \$ 50,624.21 were read, approved and ordered paid on the motion of Director Orlopp, seconded by Director McFarlin. Motion carried.

The Secretary made a report on the financial status of the District and the current status of the District's cash deposits.

The Year-to-date expenses were reviewed and compared to the budget.

The status of water was discussed. Director Ketscher moved to ratify the purchase of 3000 A.F. of Class II water purchased from Tulare Irrigation District. Director Orlopp seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Attorney Doug Jensen arrived.

The contract with the California Energy Commission was discussed. The State contract calls for a \$5,000.00 grant from the State matched by \$5,000.00 from O.C.I.D. plus \$2,000.00 of IN-KIND services provided by the district. Attorney Jensen was instructed to correspond with the Energy Commission to clarify several points which were not fully understood and to point out several errors in the Contract. It is the intention of the board to sign the Contract once clarification is received, and to proceed with the feasibility study. The \$5,000.00 matching funds provided by O.C.I.D. are to be taken from the FRESNO COUNTY Tax Distributions received to date. Motion was made by Director Orlopp, seconded by Director McFarlin. Motion carried.

The Agreement between Hills Valley Irrigation District and Orange Cove Irrigation District concerning the operation of H.V.I.D. systems was discussed and Resolution 5-80 authorizing the signing of the Agreement was made on the motion of Director Beach, seconded by Director Orlopp. All Directors voted AYE, NO NOES, NO ABSENT.

Attorney Jensen reported on the current status of Special District representation on LAFCO. Considering the possible loss of unused powers vested in the board which could be lost if special districts were represented on the LAFCO board, the board reconfirmed its opposition to such LAFCO membership unless legislation is passed to remove the possible loss of powers.

Implementation of PROPOSITION 4, passed in the NOVEMBER 1979 elections was discussed with Attorney Jensen. Because there are still many features of the new law that are unclear as to their application to the District, Attorney Jensen was instructed to contact our CPA's to get their input into implementation procedures.

The board recessed for lunch at 12:00 noon and reconvened at 1:30 P.M. with all Directors and the Secretary present. Attorney Jensen had been excused after lunch.

Tom Horne, District Engineer, reported to the board on Systems maintenance in progress and the vehicle maintenance program.

The status of the new trucks which were ordered was discussed.

Delivery dates have not yet been determined. The Dump Truck reconditioning was also discussed. Vic's Body Shop offer to repair and repaint the truck for \$300.00 plus the old Dump truck was approved on the motion of Director Ketscher, seconded by Director McFarlin. Motion carried.

The present condition of the John Deere Dozer was discussed. Tom Horne reported it would cost in excess of \$5,000 to make all the needed repairs and to install the required roll bars. Bid proposals from Quinn (Caterpillar), Kovac Equipment Co. (Case) and E.R. Bacon (John Deere) were presented to the board as follows: Including Trade-In,

Director Beach moved and Director Orlopp seconded the motion to accept the Kovac Equipment proposed for the used (197 Hrs.) Case 350 B provided we got the new equipment warranty and all associated parts books, maintenance manuals etc., provided with new equipment. Motion carried, Kovac Equipment Co., accepted provided the district paid in full by the end of May 1980. The Dozer is to be paid out of funds received from Fresno County.

Manager Ed Bickmore reported on the meeting of the Friant Water Users Association Excess Lands Committee held on May 8, 1980 at Tulare I.D. office.

The manager also reported on the ACWA convention plans made and verified intended attendance.

A verbal report was made concerning the Safety Inspection of O.C.I.D. made on May 13, 1980 by the J.P.I.A. A few minor discrepancies were noted.

The manager reported IBEW v OCID had been settled out of court as per agreement approved at the Board meeting held April 9, 1980.
